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




TCQ works to end addiction through 3 key services:


JEWELS FOR GENEROSITY

To date, TCQ has raised over \$89,000 from this partnership.












Our New Life residential rehabilitation located in the peaceful centres. rural surroundings of Toowoomba, QLD, provide a place of hope and transformation for men (18-45 years) and women (18-39 years). With separate facilities for each, these centres offer a supportive environment for individuals seeking recovery from addiction and a fresh start in life.

Unlike many rehabilitation programs, we receive no government funding. It is through the generous donations and ongoing support from people like you that Teen Challenge QLD is able to help young people move from hopelessness to hope. New Life Centres play a pivotal role in this journey, guiding individuals through their rehabilitation with compassion and care.



providing and healing THROUGH OUR FAMILY SUPPORT SERVICES



Our goal is to heal and restore families by enhancing parental skills and strengthening the parent-child relationship. Through our program, we strive to create lasting, positive change for both parents and children.



equipping Students for the future THROUGH SOCIAL ENTERPRISES

An integral part of our rehabilitation program at Teen Challenge QLD is equipping students with essential life and work skills. Our social enterprise initiatives play a key role in this process, offering practical opportunities for students to gain valuable experience, confidence, and employability. Through these hands-on programs, participants not only develop work readiness but also build a sense of purpose as they contribute to sustainable projects.

By engaging in these initiatives, we are not only empowering individuals on their journey to recovery but also working towards building a sustainable future for our organisation.







or the past four years, Empowering Lives have been running the Arrowsmith Program at Teen Challenge Queensland's residential rehabilitation centres, making us the only drug and alcohol residential service to provide this innovative cognitive enhancement program. Based on the science of neuroplasticity, the Arrowsmith Program is designed to strengthen and improve cognitive functions through targeted exercises.

Within our centres, students engage in one specific Arrowsmith exercise, Symbol Relations (also known as Clocks). Symbol Relations is a higher-order cognitive function that is responsible for understanding and connecting ideas. It is involved in tasks that enable an individual to reason using logic and to connect and process complex relationships and concepts simultaneously. It plays a vital role in logical reasoning, processing relationships, and comprehending concepts across both academic subjects and everyday life.

By offering the Arrowsmith Program, we provide our students with an additional pathway to enhance their life skills, build confidence, and equip themselves for future success. This ground-breaking initiative supports their journey to recovery and better prepares them for life and the workplace.


